  - Sports Trustee Report- Karri Rogers
    - Girl's golf took 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the MHSAA Regionals on 10/10
    - Boys' tennis battled hard at the MHSAA Regional Tournament against Ike but were eliminated in the first round.
    - Boys' varsity soccer hosted a playoff game against Ford on 10/11 but lost 1-3.
    - On Saturday 10/14 varsity volleyball competed in the BOE Invitational. Girls went 3-0 in the 1<sup>st</sup> round. They lost to GR Catholic Central in the 1st round of gold matches.
    - Girls Cross Country placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Macomb County meet at Stoney Creek on 10/14. Boys' cross country took 2<sup>nd</sup>.
    - JV and Varsity football finish their regular season this week against OLSM.
      Freshmen team will not play due to OLSM cancelling their game.
    - Varsity football playoff seeding, and location will be announced on Sunday evening.

- o Cultural and Fine Arts Trustee Report-Michelle Steinhebel
  - Band/Choir concert-DHS auditorium, tickets \$5 each, this Thursday and Friday at 7pm. So far, 425 tickets sold for Thursday and 491 tickets sold for Friday.
  - Bake sale, 50/50 and winner of "Win the Band" will be announced on Friday.
  - Choir concerts: November 7- Varsity at OU Chamber Festival, November 25- Varsity at Detroit Zoo Lights, December 1- Show Choir at Macomb Twp Tree Lighting, December 10- mixed Varsity at Festival of Lessons and Carols at St Isadore Church, December 15- Holiday Spectacular.

- School Administrative Report-Attending Administrators-Mr Koskos
  - It was a nice HOCO celebration, 1600 students attended the dance.

- School opened the Media Center Café, using the space differently than in past. It is staffed by the creative learning students.
- There were 100 new members inducted into NHS.
- PSAT was administered as a digital test. 641 juniors took it this way. The school voluntarily changed to this new way of taking it. It is an adaptive test, based on how the student completed mod 1, the program will modify their test accordingly. Students had to bring in their own laptops to complete it. There was a lot of help from the staff to make this successful. The students were aware of the seriousness of taking it.
- Furniture has been added to the atrium, giving students more space to spread out. The new areas are providing the students areas they can be comfortable in without being in the middle of the lunchroom.
